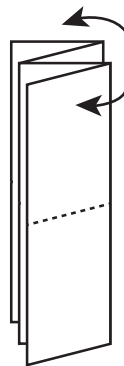
HOT DOG FOLD



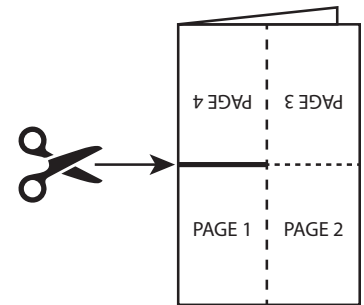
UNFOLD



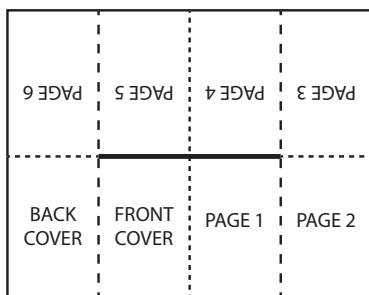
HAMBURGER FOLD



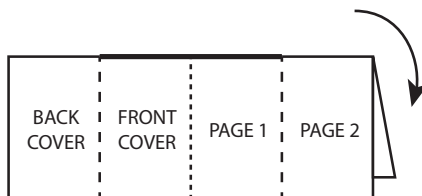
THEN ACCORDION

ON THEMSELVES)



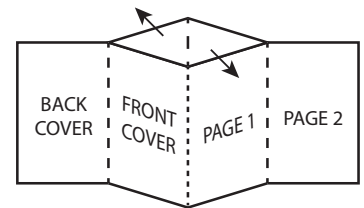
UNFOLD ACCORDION &

JUST TO THE MIDDLE



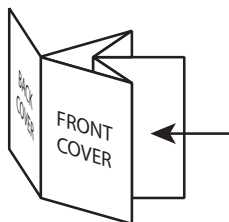
